Parish Announcements

One of the greatest traditional devotional practices in the history of the Catholic Church is the Forty Hours Devotion. It is a devotion which, although seldom seen today, has a very rich 500-year history in the Church. The blessings and graces that come from the devotion are incredible and much needed by our parish. Today, we print some excerpts from the 1909 Catholic Encyclopedia on the interesting origins and history of the devotion:

"The Forty Hours Devotion, also called Quarant' Ore or written in one word Quarantore, is a devotion in which continuous prayer is made for forty hours before the Blessed Sacrament exposed...A solemn high Mass, the 'Mass of Exposition', is sung at the beginning, and another, the 'Mass of Deposition', at the end of the period of forty hours; and both these Masses are accompanied by a procession of the Blessed Sacrament and by the chanting of the litanies of the saints...On the middle day a solemn Mass *pro pace* [for peace] is offered — if possible, at a different altar from the high altar upon which the Blessed Sacrament is exposed."

The practice first began in Milan, Italy in May, 1537. Pope Paul III granted several rich indulgences for the practice. In his decree we find some of the reasons that the devotion was started: "Our beloved son the Vicar General of the Archbishop of Milan at the prayer of the inhabitants of the said city, in order to appease the anger of God provoked by the offences of Christians, and in order to bring to naught the efforts and machinations of the Turks who are pressing forward to the destruction of Christendom, amongst other pious practices has established a round of prayers and supplications to be offered both by day and night by all the faithful of Christ, before our Lord's Most Sacred Body, in all the churches of the said city, in such a manner that these prayers and supplications are made by the faithful themselves relieving each other in relays for forty hours continuously in each church in succession, according to the order determined by the Vicar ... We, approving in our Lord so pious an

institution, and confirming the same by Our authority, grant and remit", [indulgences] etc. (*Sala, "Documenti", IV, 9; cf. Ratti in "La Scuola Cattolica" [1895], 204*).^{*}

Already before the year 1550 the 40 Hours Devotion had been established by St. Philip Neri for the Confraternity of the Trinita dei Pellegrini in Rome. This happens to be the Church that was given to the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter, so in a way we could say that the 40 Hours Devotion is particularly suited to a Fraternity parish such as ours.

What exactly happens at a 40 Hours Devotion? On the first day, a Solemn High Votive Mass of the Blessed Sacrament is sung. At the end of it, the Blessed Sacrament is exposed and a special litany and procession is made. From that time on for the next 40 or so hours, the Blessed Sacrament remains exposed, day and night, on the high altar. On the second day at a side altar, a Votive Mass for Peace is sung on a side altar. On the third day, a Votive Mass of the Blessed Sacrament is sung once again at the high altar. At the end of Mass, a procession is made, the litany is sung and the devotion is concluded with Solemn Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. During the entire period of Exposition there must always be at least two people keeping watch in the Church. There are special liturgical regulations during the time of the 40 Hours Devotion which will be discussed next week. Please sign up to keep watch for one or several hours of our 40 Hours which will take place here on February 13, 14, and 15.



Sacraments

The Traditional Latin Rites exclusively are offered at St. Stanislaus Parish

Baptisms - Parishioners, registered and active for at least four months, should call the office well ahead of the birth to arrange for the baptism of their newborn. A class with Father is necessary before the first Baptism in a family at the parish.

Holy Matrimony - Preparation for Marriage must begin at least 6 months prior to the desired date. Weddings are available for parishioners registered and active for six months before the beginning of Preparation for Marriage. Catholics must be married in the Catholic Church to have a valid marriage in the eyes of God and the Church.

First Confession, Confirmation & First Communion - Available for children of registered and active members of the parish. Preparation for these Sacraments for children will be announced in the bulletin. Adults who have not received these Sacraments are invited to call the office to arrange for special preparation by Father.

The Church Unity Octave will be prayed each day beginning January 18 and ending on January 25, the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul. During these eight days prayers are offered up for those separated from the Church that Christ founded. The Octave prayers will be prayed after Mass each day and after the sermon at the High Masses.

Church Unity Octave Prayers

Priest: How the Sacred Heart must grieve to behold so many divisions among Christian Churches separated from the one true Church He founded. Pray that Christ's plea may be realized.

Antiphon: That they may all be One, as Thou, Father, in Me and I in Thee; that they also may be one in Us, that the world may believe that Thou has sent Me. (John 17-21)

If you are having a difficult time hearing what is being said from the pulpit, ask an usher for one of our hearing-assist receivers (or get one yourself from just behind the door of the cry room). You can use your own headphones or take one of our disposable/reusable sets. If your hearing aid has a t-coil switch, you can wear a receiver loop around your neck and the audio will go directly into your hearing aid. Ask an usher, or call the office if you have any questions.

Mass Intentions: Each family may submit one scheduled Mass Intention per month. The Mass Stipend in the Diocese of Manchester is \$10, and this must accompany the request. Please use one of the Mass Intention envelopes in the envelope rack near the choir loft steps noting the preferred date and your email address for receipt. If the preferred date is not available, the next available date will be assigned.
