# **Parish Announcements**

Holy Week begins today. The "Triduum" is Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. No morning Masses are allowed during the Triduum. The Blessed Sacrament is removed from the tabernacle of the High Altar during the Triduum. One bows to the altar when the tabernacle is empty, but one genuflects to the crucifix after it is unveiled on Good Friday. Holy Water is removed from the fonts after the Mass on Thursday night until the new Easter water is made at the Easter Vigil.

Please sign up to Adore Our Lord. On Maundy (Holy) Thursday, at the end of Mass the Blessed Sacrament is moved to the Altar of Repose, Compline is recited, and the main altar stripped bare. The Altar of Repose represents the Garden of Gethsemane, and adoration at this altar continues throughout the night and Friday until the afternoon ceremony. At least two people need to be in the Church adoring at all times. There is a sign-up sheet in the vestibule; please sign up for an hour or more before you leave Mass today. Or, sign up online at

The collection on Good Friday will be the *Pontifical Good Friday Collection*, which helps Christians in the Holy Land, where they are now less than 2% of the population. Your support is essential to help the Catholic Church provide parishes, schools, and religious education. The collection also helps preserve the sacred shrines of Christianity, including Jerusalem, Nazareth, and Bethlehem, to name just a few. Catholics living there depended heavily on pilgrimages, which have been greatly limited in recent years from war and Covid. Monday, April 14 is a day for Confessions Diocese-wide. Confessions will be heard in this parish and in all parishes of the diocese from 11 a.m. until 1 p.m. and from 5 p.m. until 7 p.m. Verify specific times in a particular parish, but all the parishes are making Confession available throughout the day and into the evening as close to these times as possible.

#### Easter water, blessed during the Easter Vigil,

will be available after the Vigil and on Easter Sunday morning. All are encouraged to bring a small container from home and take some of this water to sprinkle in your homes throughout the Easter season.

There is a tradition of special Easter blessings of food. Anyone who would like to have Easter food blessed (lamb or other meats, eggs, bread, fruit, cheese, Easter baskets, etc.)



should bring it to the St. Joseph altar after the Mass on the Easter Vigil or Easter Sunday. Traditionally, this newly-blessed food is eaten at the Easter breakfast after Mass.

The Office of Tenebrae will be chanted at St. Stanislaus on Spy Wednesday (April 16) evening at 7 p.m. and Good Friday (April 18) evening at 7 p.m. Tenebrae is the Divine Office of the Church (Matins and Lauds) celebrated in a special way for the Sacred Triduum. The clergy will chant a series of psalms, chants, and lessons, lasting about two hours and is open to the public. Come to this ancient prayer to spiritually enhance your Holy Week.

for a picnic and Emmaus Walk (ref. the Gospel

reading of the day). We will meet at the large picnic area just past the cannon.

In a number of Catholic cultures, Easter Monday (which was at one point a holy day of obligation) is kept with festivity. In Italy, the day is called La Pasquetta (Little Easter) and is celebrated by taking a scampagnata, an outing to the countryside, where a picnic is held at which leftovers from Easter Sunday are eaten along with eggs, salami, cheeses, breads, pastas, calzones, torta pasqualina, frittate, savory cakes, and pizza rustica.

Each family is to bring their own picnic foods and accessories. In case of inclement weather, the event will be held in the church basement.

## **Sacraments**

**Baptisms** - Parishioners, registered and active for at least four months, should call the office well ahead of the birth to arrange for the baptism of their newborn. A class with Father is necessary before the first Baptism in a family at the parish.

Holy Matrimony - Preparation for Marriage must begin at least 6 months prior to the desired date. Weddings are available for parishioners registered and active for six months before the beginning of Preparation for Marriage. Catholics must be married in the Catholic Church to have a valid marriage in the eyes of God and the Church.

**First Confession, Confirmation & First Communion -** Available for children of registered and active members of the parish. Preparation for these Sacraments for children will be announced in the bulletin. Adults who have not received these Sacraments are invited to call the office to arrange for special preparation by Father.
