Even though a few Christmas cookies have been spotted and an occasional Christmas tune might have reached our ears by now, in the Catholic world, Christmas has not begun yet and won't until Midnight Wednesday. The intense joy of the day of the Birth of Our Lord is prolonged for a week (the Christmas Octave) and on through the full twelve days of Christmas on January 5th, Epiphany Eve. Then, the celebration takes on a new glow with Epiphany – celebrated as a “second Christmas” in many cultures. Then, the Christmas season is extended through Candlemas, February 2nd, like a star slowly fades away. So, please do not have your Christmas tree on the curb on Thursday morning. Be Catholic and give the real Christmas the extended celebration it deserves ... especially by prolonging as long as you can the Charity that the Infant Jesus brings you to show to others through your actions, words, and example.

**Christmas is a Holyday of Obligation.** Although the current Law of the Church permits those who receive Holy Communion at the Midnight Mass to receive again at one Mass on Christmas Day, Traditionally, Holy Communion could only be received once per calendar day.

**The traditional blessing of food for Christmas** will be given on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day after each Mass. Anyone with meats, eggs, bread, oil or other Christmas foods to be blessed should bring these items to the communion rail at the St. Joseph altar at any of these times.

**There are just a few days left in this calendar year** and it is a great time to consider an extra gift to your parish (or perhaps a gift, for a few!). The parish Finance Council is busy planning out the next projects and priorities to be tackled during 2025. Be assured that every dollar you give makes a big impact not only on the physical aspects of the parish but also on our ability to expand our liturgical life, classes, services, programs and everything else that a parish with the Traditional Mass should offer.
