
The gifts are all opened. Everyone is content.

TODAY!

Marriage Enrichment for the Devout: How to Grow in Holiness through Marriage will be presented by Kenneth Cramer, MA, Director of Family and Respect Life for the Diocese of Manchester **today at 1 p.m.** in the Church Basement. Devout couples are sometimes at a loss for marriage enrichment. This one-hour talk aims to help them achieve a more perfect love for each other, their family, and God by incorporating the virtues of poverty, chastity, and obedience into their life. This presentation will help them fall deeper in love with Christ, their spouse, and children.

Epiphany water has been blessed to sprinkle in your homes throughout the Christmas season, which does not end until February 2. Bring some home in your own (reasonably-sized) container while it lasts.

Take a piece of chalk which was blessed on the Epiphany and have the head of the household write the following inscription above your front door:

20 + C + M + B + 25

This represents the year (2025) and the initials of the 3 Kings, Caspar, Melchior and Bathasar. Epiphany water should be sprinkled in all the rooms of the house by the head of the household. Father did a general blessing of all parishioners' homes on the feast.

Tuesday, January 14, 2025

The “Sundays after Epiphany” can be confusing, so some explanation is in order. Some feasts are fixed on a particular date each year (e.g. Christmas, December 25th or Epiphany, January 6.). Other feasts are “moveable feasts” which means that the date changes (e.g. Ascension Thursday, which is 40 days after Easter). The date of Easter is determined by the “lunar (moon) calendar.” Because the lunar calendar only has 29 days in a month, the date of Easter moves all around our regular calendar and can be anywhere between March 22 and April 25. This means that number of weeks between Epiphany and Easter can vary by several weeks depending on whether Easter is early or late in the calendar. The 40 days before Easter, of course, are the time of Lent, and the three weeks before Lent are the time of Septuagesima. Septuagesima and Ash Wednesday (the start of Lent) – are dependent on Easter. That leaves a gap of time between Epiphany (a fixed date, January 6) and Septuagesima (a moveable date) which can be anywhere between one and six Sundays. Any of the Sundays that are not used between Epiphany and Septuagesima in a given year are used in the time at the end of the Church liturgical year, just before Advent. This year, Easter is rather late (April 20) and so five of the six variable Sundays will be used before Septuagesima begins on February 16 (which means that one extra Sunday will be used before the First Sunday of Advent).


Parish Announcements

Sacraments

The Traditional Latin Rites exclusively are offered at St. Stanislaus Parish

Baptisms - Parishioners, registered and active for at least four months, should call the office well ahead of the birth to arrange for the baptism of their newborn. A class with Father is necessary before the first Baptism in a family at the parish.

Holy Matrimony - Preparation for Marriage must begin at least 6 months prior to the desired date. Weddings are available for parishioners registered and active for six months before the beginning of Preparation for Marriage. Catholics must be married in the Catholic Church to have a valid marriage in the eyes of God and the Church.

First Confession, Confirmation & First Communion - Available for children of registered and active members of the parish. Preparation for these Sacraments for children will be announced in the bulletin. Adults who have not received these Sacraments are invited to call the office to arrange for special preparation by Father.

The Church Unity Octave will be prayed each day beginning January 18 and ending on January 25, the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul. During these eight days prayers are offered up for those separated from the Church that Christ founded. The Octave prayers will be prayed after Mass each day and after the sermon at the High Masses.

Church Unity Octave Prayers

Priest: How the Sacred Heart must grieve to behold so many divisions among Christian Churches separated from the one true Church He founded. Pray that Christ's plea may be realized.
